Select a figure from the era of the American Revolution (1773-1783). Discuss how he or she influenced the course of the American Revolution, who he or she was and his/her contribution to the founding of a new nation. Figures may be any person, whether a well-known figure or an everyday man, woman, or child who supported the American Revolution in ways large or small.

- Students are encouraged to use primary sources (i.e. immediate, first-hand accounts such as letters, diaries speeches, or newspaper reports) for their research.
- Lesser-known figures are acceptable, but subjects must have been actual participants, i.e. not fictional.
- First, second, and third place winners are selected.

NSDAR Bylaws

Daughters a the 134th Continental Congress Vote to Amend National Bylaws

June 30, 2025

Voters at the 134th Continental Congress approved several important changes to the national bylaws.

Fees and Dues

- Annual national dues were raised to \$52 for members through a chapter and to \$72 for members-at-large. The increase was based, as prescribed in the bylaws, on the cumulative three-year increase in the Consumer Price Index.
- The life member fee was set at \$1,500 in light of the increase in annual dues.

This change is effective with the upcoming dues cycle. The latest version of the bylaws of the National Society will be available on the DAR Members' Website soon.
