"Celebrating 250 Years of Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness; Happy Birthday America! 1776-2026"

The Junior American Citizens (JAC) Committee promotes civics education, American heritage and history, love of country, and service. Through JAC clubs and contests, America's children learn the principles of our democratic government and appreciation for our great country. Through these opportunities and recognition of the students' work, this committee hopes to encourage today's Junior American Citizens – the future leaders of our country.

The JAC Committee sponsors contests for children in preschool through grade 12 attending public, private, parochial or sanctioned home schools. Any child is eligible to participate in the contests – a child does not have to be a JAC club member or CAR member to enter. The contest categories are as follows:

Art: Poster Creative Poetry Community Individual

Banner Expression: Short Story Service: Group

Postage Stamp Graphic Novel/Comic Digital Art

Photographic Essay

Chapter JAC Chairs establish their own contest submission deadlines, and recognize contest winners at each grade level and contest category with certificates and pins. Chapter winners are emailed to the State JAC Chairman by **January 1, 2026**, for further judging and awards. Entries received after this date will not be considered. Keep the original entries, and email photos, scanned copies, or digital files along with a completed entry form for each submission.

Illinois is sponsoring a Youth Poster contest

Theme: Illinois Celebrates America's 250th Birthday!

Participants: Children in grades K-12 are invited to create a poster depicting how Illinois is celebrating America's 250th birthday. Posters should be created on 12" x 18" construction paper using art media of the participant's choosing except oil and soft pastel crayons. The title "*Illinois Celebrates America's 250th Birthday!*" should appear at the top of the poster. Participants should label the back of the poster with their name, age, address, phone number, grade category, sub-category, date completed and sponsoring DAR chapter.

Chapter Level: Posters will be judged in two categories: "Regular" and "Special Needs" as well as by the following grades levels: K-2, 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Chapters should choose one winner at each grade level in both categories and email a photo or scanned copy of the front and back of the winning entries to this chair by **January 15, 2026**. Chapters should keep track of the number of student participants in each category and grade level and submit this information along with the winning entries.

State Level: One winner from the "Regular" and one winner from the "Special Needs" categories for each grade level will be chosen. All winners will receive a monetary award and certificate. Their posters will be collected, framed, and displayed in a prominent community building or library in Illinois. Artwork will be returned to winners after being displayed.
