DAR Records Preservation Committee

Welcome to the DAR Records Preservation Committee!

Formerly known as the Genealogy Preservation Committee, this group of dedicated DAR volunteers works to preserve and index a wide range of records—genealogical, organizational, and membership-related—into searchable databases. These efforts support DAR genealogists and registrars by streamlining application approvals and membership record retrieval.

Exciting New Projects in Development Include:

- **Microfiche Project:** Decades of data will digitize and categorize about three million early supporting documents submitted with applications from the 1950’s through the mid 1980’s. These documents were not included in the previous Supporting Documentation Project. Many of these documents are bible records, personal family letters and even cemetery records which cannot be found anywhere else.
- **Bible Catalog Project:** DAR volunteers will categorize recently submitted bible records to the Genealogical Records Committee so that these records can be found using the bible search feature on the GRS.
