SCHOLARSHIPS ADMINISTERED BY THE ILLINOIS STATE ORGANIZATION

General Scholarships

- Each DAR District will offer one \$1,000 scholarship. If no eligible or qualified applicant is received from a district, the judges may select a winner from another district.
- DAR chapter sponsorship of an applicant is required. Each DAR chapter may sponsor ONE new applicant for a state general scholarship. A previous year's winner may apply for a renewal.
- Applicants for Illinois DAR general scholarships must attend a college or university in Illinois.

- Applications must be submitted to the chapter no later than February 1, 2026. The application chosen for sponsorship must be received by this chair no later than February 20, 2026.

General Henry Dearborn American History Scholarship

- The Illinois State Organization NSDAR will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a student who is an Illinois resident planning to major in American history
- DAR chapter sponsorship of an applicant is required. Each DAR chapter may sponsor ONE new applicant for this scholarship. A previous year's winner may also apply for a renewal.

- Applications must be submitted to the chapter no later than February 1, 2026. The application chosen for sponsorship must be received by this chair no later than February 20, 2026.

- 26 different national scholarships are offered for graduating high school seniors, and college, graduate and medical students.

- DAR chapter sponsorship is not required for NSDAR scholarships; however, applicants may want to contact a DAR chapter in their area for help with their applications.
